

What motivates and supports primary school teachers to teach food and nutrition?

INFORMATION SHEET

Primary school teachers and final year pre-service primary education students are invited to participate in research to inform development of a professional support package to assist teachers to teach food and nutrition. An important part of the project is to identify factors that influence teacher motivation to teach students about food and nutrition. Study of the relationships between these factors can help to identify professional support needs. Your input would be appreciated to help understand factors that motivate teachers at different stages of their careers. This information sheet is to explain to you what the project is about and how to be involved.

What will I be asked to do?

- You will be invited to complete an online questionnaire which will take about 15 minutes.
- The questionnaire will focus on your education and teaching experience, your nutrition literacy, your feelings about the value of teaching food and nutrition, your comfort in the role and the types of supports available.

Is participation voluntary?

- Yes, participation is entirely voluntary.

What are the benefits of taking part?

- You will gain valuable insights into factors that may influence your teaching practice.
- You will help to guide the development of a professional support package to assist primary school teachers to teach food and nutrition.
- You will be eligible to enter a draw to win a \$100 gift voucher, one drawn per 100 completed surveys.

How will privacy be protected?

- The survey is completed anonymously.
- At the end of the survey, if you wish to enter the prize draw you will be asked to give your Christian name and telephone contact.
- No identifying information will be stored with the data or used in any reports or articles about the study.
- The data will be stored for a statutory 5 years, after which time it will be securely destroyed.
